This month the Fly Fishers of Davis will hear from Leslie Ajari, who will discuss fly fishing the Trinity River. The Trinity River is the major tributary to the Klamath River and one of California's most panoramic and rewarding fly fishing rivers, with several steelhead runs and the occasional sea-run brown trout.

Leslie was born and raised in the North Lake Tahoe area among the Sierra Nevada and all their challenging but rewarding fishing. She began her adventure into the world of fly fishing at the age of 10 when her dad, who loved to fly fish and tie flies, taught her how to cast. Since then, fly fishing has become a serious addiction. After graduation from college, Leslie decided to forgo a conventional career (much to her parents dismay) and took a job where she could telecommute and travel around the country in search of epic fishing. She followed her passion and started guiding because it gave her the opportunity to share it with others. Leslie guides in Northern California and Southern Oregon. Hello Fly Fishers of Davis,


November is here and starting the month off with something we have not seen much of in a long time. Good ole rain. The steelhead fishers should be loving it with a good fresh push of water into the system.



CONSERVATION REPORT

Tunnels Project Comments The comment period for the Delta Tunnels project closed at the end of October, with the supporters submitting 12,000 comments and the opponents submitting 30,000 comments. In response, Governor Brown issued the following statement: "The Delta pipeline is essential to completing the California Water Project and protecting fish and water quality. Without this fix, San Joaquin farms, Silicon Valley and other vital centers of the California economy will suffer devastating losses in their water supply. Claims to the contrary are false, shameful and do a profound disservice to California's future."

My response to Governor Brown is that it's shameful of Governor Brown to completely dismiss the comments of 30,000 thoughtful Californians who have serious disagreements with his plan to build massive tunnels and are providing well-reasoned alternatives that would result in more water at lower cost, both economically and environmentally. The core of our democracy is to be able to disagree with our elected leaders without being dismissed as lying, shameful people stuck in the past. It's important to ask the question (on both sides) "What do you have to gain from your position?" In the case of Tunnel opponents, the gain is a better environment, existing way of life, and making the future of California better. In the case of proponents, it mostly boils down to cash in their pockets. Whose actions are shameful, and who is looking toward the future of California? Not Governor Brown.

Klamath Deal in 11th Hour The Klamath Basin Restoration Agreement is hanging by a thread. Congress has until the end of December to approve it or the whole deal falls apart. Starting over is not an option – it's not at all clear that the agreement could be reached again. The four senators representing Oregon and California are in agreement and have introduced SB133, but action remains stalled in the House. Congressmen Greg Walden, Ron Wyden, and Jeff Merkley are on board, but there is no House bill yet. Hopefully, Congressman Walden will

introduce a bill soon. Notably, Congressman Doug LaMalfa has not joined the supporters of the Agreement, despite the fact that it offers the best hope of reliable water for his constituents in Northern California.

Another Fish Kill Despite belated efforts to prevent it, over 95% of the winter-run Chinook salmon in the Sacramento River system perished this year due to high water temperatures. This marks two years in a row that very few fish survived to make the run to the ocean. The fish have a three-year life cycle so one more year of poor survival could cause their extinction. This is despite state and federal laws that protect them – water managers have been delinquent in providing conditions for their survival.

Ballot Initiative A new initiative that could spell trouble for the Twin Tunnels has qualified for the ballot. The "No Blank Checks Initiative" would force voter approval for public infrastructure bonds amounting to more than \$2 billion and requiring new or increased taxes or fees. The initiative, spearheaded by Dean Cortopassi, a Stockton area farmer, is aimed at the Delta Tunnels. It's not clear how many other projects might fall under its scope, though, so it's not clear to me whether this is a good way to fight the Tunnels project or not. The unintended consequences of the initiative could be dire.

Smith River Support The Northern California Council of the Federation of Fly Fishers has assisted the development of a partnership between the Smith River Advisory Council and the Department of Fish and Wildlife to draft a Fisheries Management Plan for the Smith River. The draft is now complete, and the NCCIFFF is continuing its support by agreeing to act as Fiduciary Agent to manage funds needed to complete the final plan. This plan is significant as it could be used as a template to manage anadromous fish in other rivers in California. It also could be a model for public/private partnership in creating policy. Just one more reason to become a member of FFF.



BOOK OF THE MONTH



“Mayflies”

By Ted Fauceglia

Ted Fauceglia set out thirty years ago to do something that would seem daunting to the even the most adept photographers: create on-stream images of mayflies in various stages of their life cycles. Considering the differences in behavior of the many species — not to mention the problems identifying them — only his passion for the subject could have led him to finish the project. He is known in the fly fishing publishing world as the foremost photographer of insects and fly patterns.

Mayflies is first and foremost a record of fascinating images of insects. It's easy to be fooled into thinking this is just the first real coffee-table book for entomologists. But the author brings with him something even more valuable: a vision of how insects are perceived by both fish and fisherman. This is where the other contents of the book — the narrative about lifecycles and the fly patterns used to imitate their various stages — glue things together.



Fauceglia, though a master fly tier in his own right, chose experts in various categories of patterns and species to author the ties he photographed for each chapter. Some of the tiers featured in the book are Kelly Galloup, Ed Jaworowski, Mike Mercer, and Art Scheck. The underlying message of this book is that over time the master tiers have learned to tie flies that *trout* choose as food, not just flies that look to *anglers* like natural insects. So for the first time in print, we get to see the differences between a mayfly viewed in almost perfect natural light and the flies that, to a trout, best imitate them.

Mayflies will remain a “photography” book for many fly fishers. It's just too hard to stop looking at the images, which achieve eye-widening level of detail. But there is much more between the covers here, and no doubt the thinking involved will inspire many others along the same path of choosing and tying flies according to a sophisticated understanding of insect life cycles. For these anglers, *Mayflies* is not just a pretty book but an invaluable reference.
