

### February Meeting, Tuesday February 26, 2019 7:30 pm @ Harper Jr. High School Enrique Garcia Presents: Fly Fishing Adventure in Patagonia

his month, Tuesday February 26 at Harper Junior High School, the Fly Fishers of Davis will be hosting guest speaker, Enrique Garcia of Lago Rosario Lodge, located in the heart of Argentinean Patagonia. Fishing in the watersheds around Lago Rosario Lodge is as varied as the landscape itself, with opportunities for everything from delicate presentations of small natural mayfly imitations on spring creeks to dredging the depths and undercut banks of raging rivers with six inch long streamers on sink tips. Enrique's presentation will focus on:

- Why fly fishing in Patagonia?
- Landscapes and waters around the lodge, common species and season conditions
- Fly fishing technics, recommended gear, flies, lines, rods and reels
- Programs description, travel issues and lodge services





Born in Buenos Aires in 1960 within a Spanish immigrant family, Enrique has been fishing since his early 6. He discovered fly fishing during the yearly '90 vacations in San Carlos de Bariloche, with friends and guides. The awesome experiences in the productive Patagonian rivers and lakes improved his fishing technics. In 2010 Enrique decided to build a lodge in Trevelin and settle down with his wife Andrea and their young daughters, Francisca (12) and Antonia (8).

Enrique is also a jazz specialist, who worked in famous theaters like Boston Symphony Hall (MA), Avery Fisher Hall Lincoln Center (NY), Carnegie Hall (NY), Royce Hall UCLA (CA), Berkeley University (CA) and John F. Kennedy Center Washington (DC), touring with Mercedes Sosa "La voz de Latinoamérica".

After many years at the BA Jazz Festival he performed the sound for artists like Branford Marsalis, Gary Peacock, Vincent Herring, Peter Bernstein and Joe Lovano.

#### **CONSERVATION REPORT**

Governor Newsom has appointed a new Chair of the Water Resources Control Board. Joaquin Esquivel has served as a board member for two years, and was assistant secretary for federal water policy at the California Natural Resources Agency from 2015-2017. He served as a research assistant to Senator Barbara Boxer for eight years prior to that. Governor Newsom did not reappoint Felicia Marcus to the Water Board – a major loss of institutional knowledge to that important body. Ms. Marcus was supported by numerous environmental groups as she proposed retaining more water in the San Joaquin River to support salmon recovery efforts and was a strong supporter of flow requirements for the Bay Delta to maintain water quality for fish and delta users.

In a related issue, Senator Diane Feinstein sent a letter to the governor supporting the appointment of Bill Lyons, a Modesto farmer, to chair the water board. In 2016, Lyons called the water board's allocation plan for water "a takings" of property without compensation. Governor Newsom did not appoint Mr. Lyons to the board, but named him as his "agriculture liaison", a new position, at an annual salary of \$175,008. Lyons was Governor Gray Davis's agriculture secretary from 1999-2004.

Governor Newsom dropped the Twin Tunnels from the WaterFix\_project, but he remains a supporter of a single tunnel and believes that change should not slow the project. It's not clear yet how the single tunnel option would affect the Bay Delta and fish recovery efforts, but it's a step in the right direction. A single tunnel would not have the capacity to divert all of the flow of the Sacramento River around the delta. Environmental groups applauded the effort, but are also withholding support pending a review of new plans for the project.

The Bureau of Reclamation released a new biological assessment for the coordinated long-term operation of the Central Valley Project and State Water Project. This is a result of the Trump Administration's efforts to reduce regulations and send more water to south-of-the-delta agricultural interests. Needless to say, agricultural groups

embraced the effort and environmental/fishing groups lamented it.

"The current, outdated biological opinions have been plagued with operational problems that experts determined were largely ineffective at helping the endangered fish they were intended to help," said Mike Wade, executive director of the California Farm Water Coalition. "In addition, the two outdated biological opinions often worked against one another, such as requiring more upstream storage for salmon to keep temperatures lower and at the same time, requiring more water to be released to the Delta to benefit smelt. These biological opinions have failed all parties – fish and wildlife, communities, and farmers," he said.

The Golden Gate Salmon Association called the announcement a step towards abandoning federal rules governing the damaging effects of the giant state and federal water diverting pumps in the Delta, which were adopted in 2008 and 2009.

"This is a blatant water grab that threatens thousands of fishing jobs and families in California," said GGSA secretary Dick Pool who also owns Pro Troll tackle company. "For the administration to claim that the giant federal water project, which includes the massive diversion pumps in the Delta, can run at full bore and not harm salmon runs is simply not credible."

"We've seen what happens when water users are given free rein to divert Bay-Delta water. It was the norm prior to 2008 and it killed so many baby salmon attempting to get to the ocean that all ocean salmon fishing had to be shut for the first time in history in 2008 and 2009," said GGSA director Mike Aughney who also publishes USAfishing.com.

The Bureau of Reclamation announced initial water allocations this week. North of Delta contractors will get 70%, Eastside contractors will get 100%, agricultural contractors south of the delta get 35%, and municipal and industrial water users south of the delta will get at least 75% of the contracted amount.
