Introductory Fly Tying Class Will Begin January 8, 2020

The fantasy shared by fly fishermen is that tying flies is cheaper than buying them. The reality is that while fly tying does provide angling entertainment during those cold Winter months when fishing is less attractive, and bad weather is howling outside, the real truism is that you'll feed more moths than fish ... and are more likely to spend more money on colored feathers and bits of dander – than you do on your mortgage.

Then again, you're certain to be the toast of your friends, as they gleefully help themselves to your fly box – then offer a scathing critique of your finest work.

To be sure, Fly tying ain't for the faint of heart.

To assist you in acquiring this skill set, the Davis Fly Fishers will be hosting their annual Beginning Fly Tying class at the UC Davis Viticulture lab starting in January. The course will cover a dozen different patterns, equally split among dry and wet flies, and will host discussions on materials, hooks, and tools, as well as allowing instructors an opportunity to pontificate on insects, strong drink, and tales of daring do (which must be taken with a grain of salt), and should task your "small finger skills" and lead to much swearing and great frustration on your part.

Imitating what fish eat is the final frontier for most fly fishermen. Learning the characteristics of shape, swimming motion, and lifecycle removes much of the guesswork in pattern selection, and combined with direct observation of environment and stream conditions, allows you to transition from guessing what fish eat to outright predation, and will improve all aspects of your time afield. While we're acquainting you with Hackle Tip wings and Spun deer hair, will be reinforcing how your imitation can better simulate the real bug, and how to fish them in the Wild.

The dates for the class will be January 8, 15, 22, 29, and February 5, and 12th. Each class will start at 7:00 PM and extend until 9:00 PM, instructors will be there a bit earlier to set up the AV gear, so there is ample opportunity to engage in additional discussion prior to the class start. The course will cost \$15 (collected at the first session). Typically class sizes are small, and talented instructors usually outnumber students, so this is an opportunity to get quality assistance in an intimate setting.

No tools or materials will be needed by prospective attendees, we'll provide all materials, vises, bobbins, and scissors for those that lack tools. However, if students have their own tools, please bring them to class.

CONSERVATION REPORT By Lowell Ashbaugh

Westlands Water District had another card up their sleeves when they abandoned work on raising Shasta Dam. They continue their insistence on taking northern California water to irrigate marginal farmland (thereby dumping selenium-laden waste water into the environment. The latest assault on California's water comes from the Department of Interior and Director David Bernhardt, who formerly worked as a lobbyist for Westlands Water District. Interior is now thinking of granting WWD a permanent contract for up to 1.15 million acre-feet of water (WWD is currently a junior water rights holder and is at the back of the line for water). This deal is made possible by a 2016 federal law (the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act (WIIN)) that Bernhardt lobbied hard for. It allows WWD to convert its contract with Interior provided that it pays off everythin it owes on the existing contract.

The deal would allow Westlands to reimburse the costs (somewhere in the neighborhood of \$300 million) of erecting the dams and canals that deliver water via the Central Valley Project. One of the major sources of water for the CVP is Trinity Lake, which was created specifically to provide Trinity River water to Central Valley farmers. But the Bureau of Reclamation currently has six times more water rights than exist in the Trinity.

Environmental groups argue that granting Westlands the full amount of water that it was allowed 50 years ago is bad water policy.

North Coast Congressman Jared Huffman has been critical of the deal, saying, "The Interior Department needs to look out for the public interest, and not just serve the financial interests of their former lobbying clients."

It looks like there's a public comment period open until January 8. Comments can be mailed to Erma Leal at <u>eleal@usbr.gov</u>. If you like fishing the Trinity River, it might be worth your while to make a comment.

I mentioned a few months ago that the Trump administration stopped publication of the biological opinions produced by scientists at the National Marine Fisheries Service and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Those BiOps indicated that endangered Chinook salmon, steelhead, and other listed fish would be adversely affected by the preferred alternative (sending more water south). The BiOps were revised under new scientists and now state that endangered fish would not be jeopardized by increased diversions of water from the Delta. They assert that continued and increased diversions can be monitored so that they're higher when the fish are not in the area and lowered when they could adversely affect them. Of course, this assumes extensive monitoring of fish populations and locations. It's not at all clear that this necessary monitoring would take place or be effective.

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality

Control Board took public testimony to heart this week and altered a proposed plan to allow 25 years of selenium discharge into the San Joaquin Valley River from the Grasslands Bypass Project in Merced and Fresno counties. Restore the Delta, Pacific Coast Federation of Fishermen's Associations, Institute for Fisheries Resources, and numerous other groups testified to the harmful effects of selenium discharges. The board reduced the discharge permit to two years with a required review in December 2021.

As one advocate said, "In my 40 years of participating in Water Board hearings, I have never seen a situation where testimony changed the outcome." It's not a perfect win for the environment, but it's better than 25 years of unmitigated selenium discharge.
