----- Outings Report ------

There has been one outing since the last meeting: to the Klamath. In a word SLOW except for in Jim Wright's boat where guide Greg Dean showed the results of over 10 years on the upper river. The largest fish taken approached 6 pounds, and there was various age classes in between that one and the salmon smolts most hooked. Clearly much slower than last year and reflective of the very poor half pounder trip to the Klamath at Labor Day. Next year we will probably move this trip into November and consider also the Trinity, depending on which is then fishing better.

At the meeting we will continue with signups through early April. By meeting time the dates for both Baum (tentative because of weather) and Iron Canyon should be set.
